## Structured Problem-Solving

Just as the recent flooding was occurring in the Midwest Division, I attended a class hosted by the Short Line Safety Institute and presented by the SmartForce Group. While it was difficult to be away during this challenging time, the topic of Structured Problem-Solving was extremely relevant in this age of daily data overload. It may be easy to do what has always worked rather than take the time to investigate the root cause or find a real solution to a problem. Many times, we only fix the symptoms or in some cases the wrong problem!

As you approach a problem, consider the following five problem-solving principles:

- 1. Slow down to speed up do a quick analysis and really understand the issue.
- 2. Get to the root of the problem ensure that you aren't just fixing symptoms.
- 3. Apply divergent and convergent thinking involve others and brainstorm ideas.
- 4. Employ hypothesis-driven analysis use your experience, but avoid over-analyzing.
- 5. Lead to action develop a plan and execute it.

As flood recovery progresses, these strategies have helped me make quality decisions. We all have mountains to climb in the upcoming days, weeks, months, and years. How we safely climb these mountains as a team is what makes us Rock Solid!
